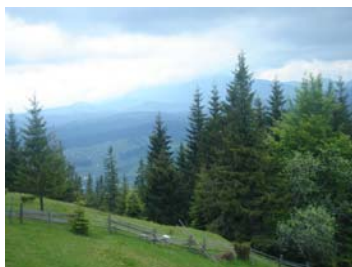
Environmental Management in Europe

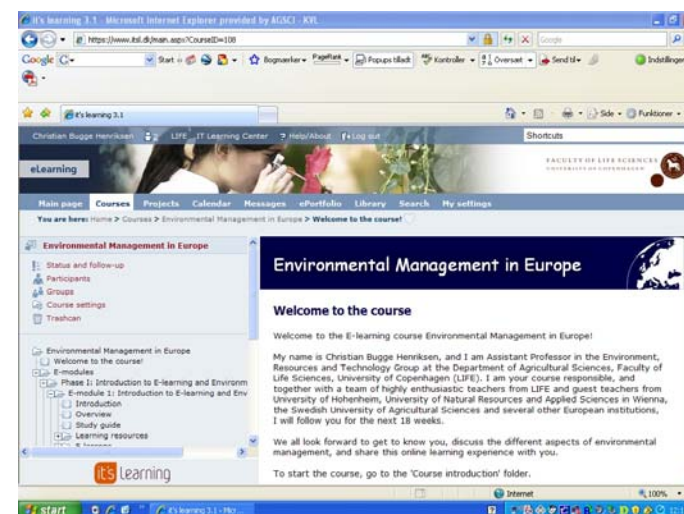
This course is for students who want to:

- Understand how insight and skills in natural sciences are combined with economics, law and planning in contemporary environmental management
- Comprehend how tools and resources for environmental management of natural resources (soil, water, air and biodiversity) are used to acquire knowledge about the environment and solve environmental problems
- Comprehend the background, principles and managerial approaches embedded in EU environmental law and policy
- Analyse and discuss different EU environmental policy initiatives (e.g. The Water Framework Directive, Natura 2000 and the Climate Change Strategy)
- Reflect on how environmental ethics and sustainability concepts of different stakeholders affect EU and international environmental policy



Teaching and course contents:

E-learning modules (E-modules) with weekly deadlines, starting in week no. 35, 2010 and examination in week no. 4, 2011. The course can be followed from anywhere in the world. It is open for MSc students from Denmark, Europe and the rest of the world.
